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#### From the Pastors

#### **Lutheran World Relief**

As we once again collect supplies for the school kits to be sent to Lutheran World Relief, it may be interesting to know about the organization.

Lutheran World Relief (LWR) was officially founded in 1945, as Lutherans in the United States began responding to the refugee crisis in post-World War II Europe by sending food, clothing and quilts. By the end of the decade, LWR was also sending relief aid to those affected by conflicts in Palestine, Hong Kong, Korea and Bangladesh. In 1979, LWR opened it first regional office in Peru. Currently, LWR has works in 21 countries and has 3 regional offices in Asia, Africa and Latin America. It is now headquartered in Baltimore Maryland. LWR is a member of the ACT Alliance, a

global alliance of churches and related agencies working on development that are committed to working together.

In the 1980s, famine in Africa made international headlines, especially the plight of people in Ethiopia. In response,

LWR shipped 5,000 tons of wheat to northern Ethio-Lutheran pia. Since 2000, LWR has increased its emphasis on sustainable agriculture and

climate adaptation while

continuing to respond to major natural disasters and humanitarian crises around the world.

One of LWR's flagship programs – started in 1945 and continuing today – is its Quilt & Kit Ministry. Each year, Lutherans across the United States assemble and donate quilts, blankets, school kits and several other kinds of care kits to assist people living in poverty in times of emergency or great need.

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#### Going Up! Elevator Project Update

Relief

As of July 21, 2019, the Elevator Fund has \$105,577.80! Thank you to all who have been contributing so generously to the Ele-

vator Fund. The giving has been incredible and amazing! We only need \$67,250.20 more in the fund to commence with the vote for the project!

On June 30th, the congregation was presented with a proposal and costs for the project. On July 21st, Horst Construction came to the church for a forum to discuss further details, present plans, give a tour of the proposed site (at the downstairs entrance to the Christian Education building) and answer questions. The total cost of the proposed project is \$342,828, which includes electrical upgrades, a stone veneer on the lower external portion of the elevator addition, and the addition of a second entrance directly into the Fellowship Hall. Augmenting the money given directly to the Elevator Fund, the project is proposed to be also funded with \$95,000 from the Improvement Fund (from the sale of the Chapel) and \$75,000 in undesignated bequests from the Memorial Fund. Things are going up!

# Lutheran World Relief Ingathering Donations Needed

Every Fall, our synod makes an appeal called an "Ingathering" to collect quilts, school kits, baby care kits, and soap to be sent all over the world to those in need through Lutheran World Relief. For the last several years, Muddy Creek has been assembling school kits that were utilized by refugees in need, collecting soap, and making flannel blankets. We will have another blanket Sunday on August 25 after both services.

This year we plan again on assembling school kits on Sunday, September 15th. You can help by donating the following new items (please pay attention to the specifics of each item, as it is a requirement that each LWR kit be identical; no religious or patriotic symbols please):

- 70 sheet spiral notebooks, wide or collegeruled, approx. 8 x10 1/2
- Small blunt scissors (or safety scissors)
- Black or blue ballpoint pens—new
- Crayons, 16 or 24 per box
- 12" rulers
- This year, we do not need pencils, erasers or sharpeners (we have enough left over from previous years to cover the amount we will need this year).

You can also help by donating new bars of soap in original wrappers (4—5 oz. size).


