You, your family, and your neighbors are all invited to come to Christmas Eve Candlelight services at Muddy Creek on Sunday, Dec. 24. The first service is at 4:30 p.m. and will include carols, a children's message, a sermon, children's bells, and a candle lighting. This may be a good option for those who have other evening celebrations with family, prefer not to drive late at night, or who have family members who go to bed earlier.

The second service is at 10:30 p.m. and will include carols, a sermon, communion, and a candle lighting. This is an excellent traditional option for those who wish to worship late in the evening and greet Christmas Day at midnight.

Note: Since Christmas Eve falls on a Sunday, we will have Sunday morning services at 8:00 a.m. and 10:15 a.m. on that day. While they are technically Advent services, we will be getting in the Christmas spirit because all the hymns at the 10:15 a.m. service will be Christmas carols.

Also, please note that on Sunday, Dec. 31, there will be only one service, at 9:00 a.m. We hope to see you on Christmas Eve!

Caring Tree Collection for Good Samaritan Shelter

This year for the Christmas Caring Tree, we are collecting items for women and their children who are at the Good Samaritan Women's Shelter in Ephrata. The Caring Tree will be in place by the mailboxes beginning Sunday, November 26. We are collecting laundry detergent, Swiffer Wetjet all purpose multi-surface floor cleaner pads, Swiffer Sweeper wet mopping pads refills, Swiffer Wetjet multi-purpose floor cleaner solution, disinfectant wipes, multi-purpose surface cleaner, Scrubbing Bubbles bathroom cleaner, diapers (size 5 and 6), baby wipes, paper towels, facial tissue, 13 gallon drawstring trash bags, cotton swab sticks, twin bedsheet sets, new pillows for beds, comforters for twin beds, new bath towels, . We are also collecting gift cards from Ephrata businesses such as Roma Pizza and Scratch Bakes, and also gift cards for Walmart and Weis Grocery stores. Unwrapped Christmas gifts for children are also welcome, such as plush toys, liquid motion bubbler sensory toys, expandable magic balls, plush knot pillows, kid's floor cushions, reading pillows, and activity busy boards. Please be sure to write your designations for your offering on the outside of each envelope: Current, Benevolence (mission to Synod and ELCA), Building/Improvement, Other (such as altar flowers, bulletins, World Hunger, Good Samaritan Fund, Ephrata Area Social Services, etc.), or Special Envelopes (Communion, Lent, Easter, Thanksgiving, and Christmas)—money goes to the mission of the Synod and ELCA unless it is designated otherwise.

*Other ways to give besides envelopes: Simply Giving Program (an automatic deduction from your bank account - talk to Nedra Bearinger if you are interested), Bill Pay from your bank, or clicking on the "Give Online" button on the church website, mclchurch.org.
